Please spread the word to your golfing buddies and any organizations that may be interested in sponsoring the tournament. We are also looking for donations for our silent auction and items for our goodie bags.

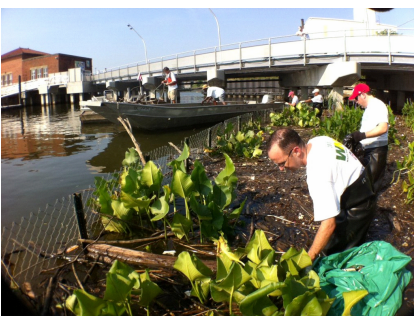

On Friday, July 29, 2011, we celebrated the Washington Nationals’ “Green Up Day,” along with community partners and over 50 volunteers, who cleaned up the Kenilworth and Diamond Teague Park.



Volunteers cut down invasive species, cleaned out trash traps in streams that lead to the Anacostia River, and donned waders to get in the water and clean out trash that had collected along the riverbed (pictured below). Dozens of bags of trash were removed from the river areas.

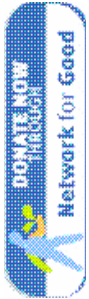

My tub is leaking water which has caused a water pipe to burst. I have to sit in a chair for a sponge bath... because of both knee replacements, I can't get all the way in the tub. I don't want to get in the tub and not be able to get out. **While getting this application together, the ceiling has fallen down in my living room where the tub sits in the bathroom above.** I am glad I wasn't walking under the ceiling at the time it fell. I hope you can help me..."
